

## Refugee and IDP Data—2020

At the end of 2020, **82.4 million** people had been forcibly displaced from their homes:

There are more displaced people today than at any time since World War II.

#### Countries with Most IDPs

- Colombia 8.3 million IDPs
- Syria 6.7 million
- Democratic Republic of the Congo 5.2 million
- Yemen 4.0 million
- Somalia 3.0 million

### Refugees and Venezuelans Displaced Abroad

#### Top (5) Countries of Origin for Refugees

- Syria 6.7 million refugees
- Venezuela 4.0 million displaced abroad
- Afghanistan 2.6 million refugees
- South Sudan 2.2 million refugees
- Myanmar 1.1 million refugees

#### Top (5) Host Countries for Refugees

- Turkey 3.7 million refugees
- Colombia 1.7 million
- Pakistan 1.4 million
- Uganda 1.4 million
- Germany 1.2 million

### Asylum Seekers

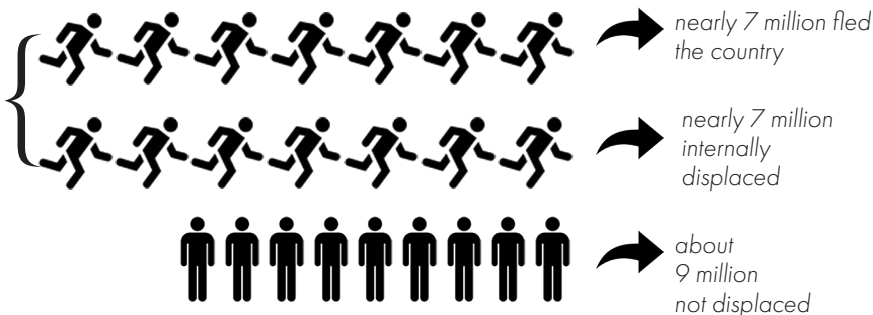
#### Received Most Asylum Applications (in 2018)

### Syrian Refugees

- 1 in 4 refugees worldwide are Syrian
- more than 80% of Syrian refugees live in Syria's neighboring countries

- about 400,000 killed
- over 1 million injured
